FIELDS: Some brief information about the project

Today, there are new challenges and opportunities for agriculture in the EU because of climate change and the rise of the environment consciousness, which has motivated the reutilization of secondary products and, more respectful products or processes.

However, to face these challenges, new models and abilities are needed in the food and drink sector. Thus, the identification of new skills and abilities needed in bioeconomy, sustainability and technology is mandatory to promote EU agricultural sector competitive and sustainable in the long term.

The FIELDS project, where 31 partners from 12 different countries participate, will help to discover which problems do the EU agricultural sector faces today and which skills are necessary to face them.

The FIELDS project aims to design strategies to promote knowledge transfer by means of training at the European Union, through innovative training and focusing on the needed skills and especially directed towards people in initial training and farmers.

The FIELDS project analyzes the skill needs through focus groups, scenario analysis and innovative curricula to design new methodologies.

This project is funded by the Erasmus+ program.




On 14-16th October, during the celebration of the #ErasmusDays, ISEKI Food Association participates as a member of the FIELDS project.

FIELDS committed with Pact for Skills

The European Commission has launched the Pact for Skills, a skills partnership for the Agri-Food Ecosystem. The agriculture and food industry are the biggest producing and manufacturing sectors in Europe and has:



More than 10 million farms and 22.000 agri-food cooperatives in the EU, that create 20 million employees, especially in rural areas.



More than 294.000 food processing companies that provide jobs for 4.8 million people.

This sector faces challenges, e. g. Climate change and globalization, changing consumer demands, generational renewal, and strong competition from 3rd countries, not to mention COVID-19.

These challenges also represent opportunities for the companies: digitalization or transition towards a more circular and bio-based economy. There is also a need for high-skilled workers such as agronomists, machinery specialists, C-level employees, sustainability experts, food scientists, food technologists, and high craftsmanship in the different sub-sectors.

In this context, Pact for Skills represents an opportunity to upskill and reskill the current workforce and make the agri-food ecosystem more attractive to young people, while providing a life-long learning perspective to both employers and employees, discovering which skills are needed and developing a roadmap towards this ambition: strategy to design and implement a sectoral upskilling and reskilling framework, maximizing competitiveness of all the actors involved, enhancing job retention and job attractiveness of the agri-food ecosystem.

The FIELDS project will take part, among other companies, associations, EU organizations, national federations, universities or training centers, supporting the EU to develop this plan.
