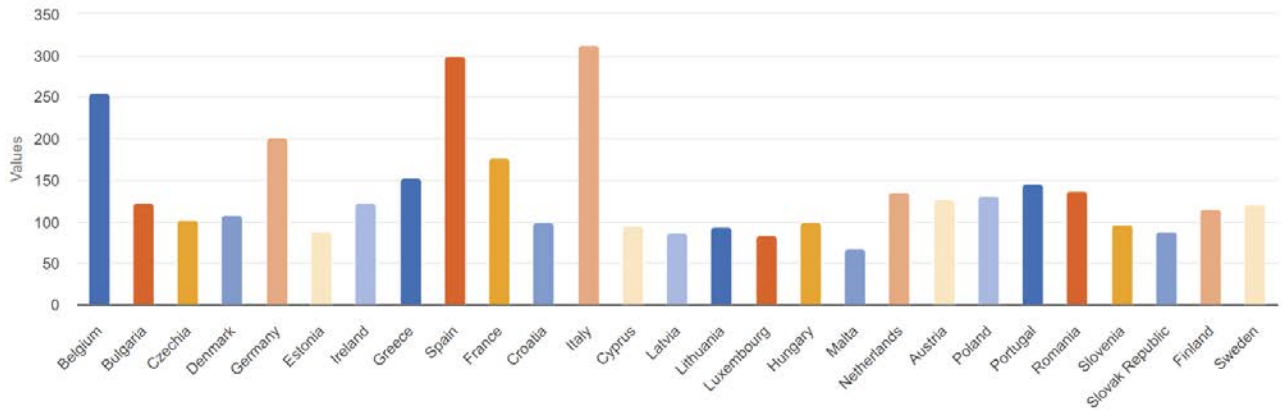
The Agrifood Pact for Skills - A Young Initiative:
